We expect our students to learn how to professionally produce, analyze and discuss scientific material. We also expect our students to become adept at providing clinical services to a diverse population. And, most importantly, we expect our students to learn to integrate these two goals. As our mission in the TC catalogue notes: The driving objective of our clinical psychology programme is to provide rigorous training in both modern clinical science and clinical assessment and A good part of the training, especially research-related training, occurs through intensive participation in a research laboratory directed by a specific faculty mentor. It is in this context, through this laboratory, that students develop their scientific skills and begin to present their work at professional conferences and publishing in professional journals. Each student, of course, is also part of a group of doctoral students with whom they learn, collaborate and socialize. In recent years, graduates of our doctoral program have gained employment in tenured academic positions, as research scientists in medical schools and as clinical researchers in a wide range of treatment settings. In addition, many of our graduates practice independently, as well as in a community environment for an under-served population. Clinical presentation of the case, as well as presentation of research, during the third year, each demonstrates the ability of students to integrate theory, research and practice. Doctoral dissertation, which must be completed no later than the seventh year after matriculation. First year During the first year of study, in addition to participating in the research laboratory, doctoral students usually take the following didactic courses: Ethical and Professional Questions in Clinical Psychology (CCPX 5030), Psychological measurement (HUDM 5059), courses on statistics and modelling; Methods of research in social psychology (ORL 5040), Pediatric Psychopathology (CCPX 5034), Adult psychopathology (CCPX 5032), History and Systems of Psychology (CCPX 6020), dynamic psychotherapies (CCPX 5037). Students also take two semesters of psychological testing and diagnostic evaluation (CCPX 5330, CCPX 5333) and clinical interviewing course (CCPX 5539). Second year During the second year, didactic courses of students include brain and behavior (BBS 5068, 5069), Cognition, emotions and culture (CCPX 5020), Psychotherapy with Children (CCPX 5531), Cognitive, behavioral and interpersonal therapies (CCPX 5038), Clinical work with different populations (CCPX 5036), seminar on life course development (HUDK 6520). In addition, students apply for a full year of practica research with a faculty member (culminating in an empirical project of the second year), year-round psychodynamic psychotherapy with practices (CCPX 6335) and additional elective year-round clinical rotation (e.g. on psychotherapy of children and adolescents; at neuropsychological evaluation). Third year third year didactic courses include group dynamics: System Perspective (ORL 5362); dissertation seminar (CCPX 7500). There is also a year-round advanced psychodynamic clinical practice (CCPX 6336) and one-semester surveillance and consultation practice (CCPX 6333). Most students also choose year-round family practice therapy (CCPJ 6363). The fourth and fifth years of the fourth year are usually focused on clinical outsourcing (CCPX 5230) and extensive dissertation work. A full fourth year of practicum psychotherapy (CCPX 6338) is recommended, although it is not required. The fifth year is usually spent on a year-round clinical internship (CCPX 6430). The programme allows only 12 graduate points to be transferred from another institution. For practica, workshops or independent study, transfer credits are not allocated.
